


2025 is especially focused on reaching our neighbors by exercising hospitality, as we have explored the Scriptural truth that God uses everyday hospitality to advance the gospel throughout the globe. We ramped-up to Easter with a lenten season of fasting and prayer for our neighbors, culminating with the hospitality-focused sermon series *Preparing a Seat at the Table*. Throughout the year we have continued to explore ways to grow in hospitality through our study of Proverbs and Jesus' face to face encounters.

Through it all, we prepared literal seats at 7 new tables on the freshly-completed Backyard Pavilion! Keep reading to see how God is beginning to transform the neighborhood around our building as we engage neighbors in this new space.

WHAT WE'RE CELEBRATING

We have seen an increase of people participating in each category of Community Life! This Fall we added a new DTM called, "Actually, Love Your Neighbor" that gives practical, scriptural, and realistic instruction on how you can literally love your neighbors. We almost doubled baptisms from 9 last year to 16 this year! God is bringing people to himself and he is using LifePointe Church in that process! God is on the move!

WHAT'S NEXT

We have a goal that each member of LifePointe Church would engage 2 of their neighbors somewhere on the disciple-making pathway by October 2026. This is a bold prayer! We do this with Jesus' Great Commission in mind:

NEXTSTEPS 2026 VISION PROGRESS

- 4years 2025 was year 3 and we focused on Christian Hospitality by "Preparing a Seat at the Table." We launched a new key initiative called "Belonging," led by Elder Ross Ridgeway. His team established a new weekly ministry called "LifeConnect" to engage those new to LifePointe and help them take next steps in our disciple-making pathway.
- 3 Global Partners We've sent two global partners from within our church and aim to send a third in the final year of our vision.
- 2 Neighbors We're taking steps to engage our neighbors with a new initiative called "Actually Love Your Neighbor" led by Pastor Craig whose team produced a DTM focused on equipping believers in evangelism through neighboring.
- 1 Transformed Neighborhood We have completed Phase One of our Backyard community gathering space through many partners, including the Backyard Team, Nature in the City, the Grounds Crew Ministry, Rudkin Contracting, Artistic Escapes Landscaping, Red Truck Tree Farm, and many more.

- After completing phase one, our neighbors have noticed that we are building a bridge of connection with them. Here's what a few have said:

BELONGING / LIFECONNECT UPDATE

As we reflect on a year of growth and connection, we are excited to highlight our "Belonging" initiative, a foundational strategy for our church that will continue to shape our community through the end of next year and beyond. At the heart of this initiative is our Sunday morning LifeConnect gathering, a vibrant space where friendships flourish and deeper community engagement thrives.

Since launching LifeConnect on June 8th, we have gathered weekly to foster relationships and explore the messages from our Sunday sermons in more depth. Each gathering has welcomed between 10 and 15 folks, including new faces alongside familiar friends, all eager to connect and share. Our mornings have been filled with laughter over coffee and a generous selection of donuts, along with engaging icebreaker questions—like reminiscing about high school mascots—and thought-provoking discussions about real-life topics.

We are delighted to report that many participants have taken significant steps forward, "graduating" to other Sunday morning groups such as the college-aged DTM and our neighboring DTM. Additionally, our mid-week LifeGroups have welcomed new members eager to deepen their relationships. We're also thrilled to see so many volunteering for various church service opportunities, further enriching our community.

We invite everyone to continue joining us for fellowship, laughter, and, of course, more donuts! Together, we are fostering a culture that truly welcomes every person into our community. Thank you for being a part of this incredible journey!




WHAT WE ARE CELEBRATING

God is faithful! He has been with us as we work toward our 4 year vision of Next Steps 2026 Engaging the Nations and the Neighborhoods! In 4 years, see 3 nations reached, 2 neighbors engaged and 1 neighborhood transformed. God is on the move!

Our elders met for a focus day in Nov. 2024 to discern where we should focus our attention in the last 2 years to accomplish our vision. We need to focus on 2 of our own neighbors into the disciple-making pathway by engaging 2 of our own neighbors. They have commissioned Pastor Craig Fortunato to develop a team to help our church "Actually, Love Your Neighbor"!

Fall of 2025, we launched our first *Actually, Love Your Neighbor* DTM on Sunday mornings with over 20 people learning what the Bible says about loving God and loving our neighbors in a gospel-driven way.



WHAT'S NEXT

This January 2026, we will start a weekly Serve 6.8 Resource Center located in our gym, to love our neighbors struggling financially by providing food and clothing supplied by our ministry partners at Serve 6.8. This is an exciting opportunity to be the hands and feet of Jesus to people in need and to actually love our neighbors.

We look forward to inviting the church's neighbors to a block party to kick off the summer of 2026 and enjoy our transformed backyard!

WHAT WE'RE CELEBRATING

Our Early Childhood and Elementary Ministries have experienced growth this year. Early Childhood Ministry, led by Victoria Rangel, has more than doubled in size, and welcomes 1-3 new families each month. During our Easter Eggstravaganza outreach, over 600 people attended, with more than 60% coming from our local community. Nearly 100 free Bibles were distributed, and every family received guided teaching and supplies for a Resurrection Egg kit to continue faith conversations at home.

Our Elementary Ministry, led by Jeri Templeton, also had a wonderful year. Jeri continues to faithfully shepherd children and families each Sunday, and she led this summer's Vacation Bible School, which welcomed 153 kids for a week of worship, fun, and learning about God's love.

We're celebrating God's faithfulness as we expand both our reach and our impact. Families are not only attending but engaging more deeply in gospel-centered connection and discipleship. We're deeply grateful for the incredible volunteers who serve each week, creating welcoming spaces, sharing the love of Jesus, and helping children take their very first steps in faith.

WHAT'S NEXT

We are looking ahead with excitement for continued community outreach, new family growth, and volunteer expansion, all while keeping lesus at the very center of everything we do. Our prayer is that every event, classroom, and interaction continues to point children and families toward a deeper relationship with Him.

Looking ahead, Katrina Hall will step into leadership for next year's VBS, building on the strong foundation that's been laid and helping even more families connect to Jesus and one another.

WHAT WE'RE CELEBRATING

This year we are celebrating our students taking great steps in learning to read and understand the Bible on their own. We have been marching through reading the New Testament each of the last 3 summers and meeting weekly to discuss our reading at Dutch Bro's (we will complete the New Testament Next Summer). This past year we also devoted our Sunday night LifeGroups during the school year to focus on teaching students to interpret scripture well. In the Spring of 2025 we learned to study a New Testament letter by looking at Ephesians. This Fall we have been dialed in on the book of Psalms and how to interpet poetry in the Bible. We are excited not only about the fruit that this is producing now, but about the way we trust the Lord will use this in the lives of our students for years to come!

WHAT'S NEXT

As we look ahead, we are so excited to continue to see our Student Ministries Intern, Carter Closson, grow in all areas and seek to discern what his future in ministry might look like. Our Student Ministry is also continuing to grow & skew younger in age, so we will be seeking to help our younger students make their faith their own over the next few years. To be faithful in this ministry opportunity, we will need more new volunteer leaders to help these young students grow in Jesus!

Our Care Ministries include a faithful team of leaders and volunteers who extend Christ's compassion through presence, prayer, and practical support. Together, they reach widows, nursing home residents, shut-ins, and those in seasons of loss or illness. They extend comfort and connection through genuine, Christ-like care.

GROUPS AND SERVING

- **Two social gatherings** for widows: Pumpkins & Praise (Nov. 2024, 8 attending) and Valentine Brunch (Feb. 2025, 15 attending).
- Weekly Sunday worship services at Creekside Village (3–15 attending) and Poudre Canyon Healthcare & Rehabilitation (15–20 attending), with devotionals and study materials distributed regularly.
- **14 trained caregivers** reached out monthly to 35 care receivers, including widows, widowers, and the chronically ill.
- **15 crafters,** from the Sharing the Love Interest Group, supported more than 25 ministry projects, creating cards, blankets, and gifts that help our church family show care and encouragement in tangible ways.

WHAT WE'RE CELEBRATING

We praise God for how He has worked through these ministries this year. Widows have found comfort and friendship through gatherings and Coffee Connection moments. Nursing home residents are growing in faith; one even began leading a Bible study among peers. Our Care Team continues to walk faithfully with those who are grieving or homebound, bringing prayer, companionship, and reminders of God's love.

Through Sharing the Love, handmade cards and gifts have become meaningful yet straightforward tools that help people express care and kindness. Stories continue to emerge of neighbors and friends touched by these thoughtful acts each one a small reflection of the love of Jesus shared through His people.

WHAT'S NEXT

Looking ahead, we aim to deepen the spiritual impact and reach of these ministries. Coffee Connection gatherings may include regular times of prayer and devotion. Our nursing home services will continue to bring worship and encouragement to residents while supporting their families in times of loss. The Care Team will focus on partnering with LifeGroups for broader connection and support, and Sharing the Love will explore new ways to equip our congregation with creative tools for encouragement and outreach.

WHAT WE'RE CELEBRATING

It was another GREAT year for being salt and light in our community - we estimate 1,563 people were directly engaged through LifePointe's local outreach ministries with the good news of the gospel of Jesus! Our Children's Ministry put on the Easter Eggstravaganza, which was attended by well over 600 people! It was an effort of hospitality full of tons of fun, the gospel message, and many of our neighbors.

This year we hosted our largest Thanksgiving and Christmas outreaches yet as part of the region-wide Adopt-A-Family ministry through our partners at Serve68. At these events practical needs are met, and the gospel is shared. Praise God!

- The generosity of LifePointe in supporting 21 Global Partners through 15 sending organizations, with more than 65% of partner funds focused on unreached people groups.
- We also celebrate the faithful work of our partners around the world and Janet Brown's transition back to LifePointe Church in 2026. As she reenters life and ministry here, we recognize the church's vital role as a harbor for returning missionaries—walking with her in rest, renewal, and continued service for the kingdom.
- Over 13% of LifePointe's total operating budget directly supports the Global Missions Fund, demonstrating LifePointe's deep and ongoing commitment to glorifying God among the nations.

- In the coming year, the Global Partnership Team will focus on equipping the next generation of global partners. 
